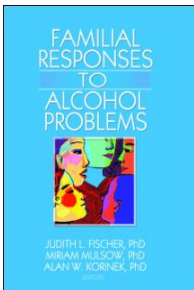

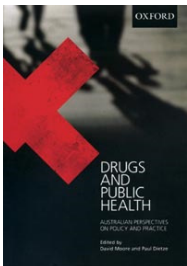


#### **Familial responses to alcohol problems**

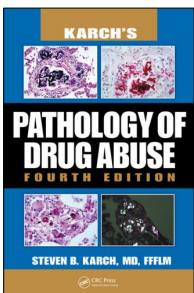

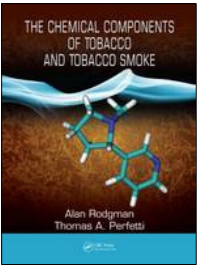


#### **Karch's pathology of drug abuse**

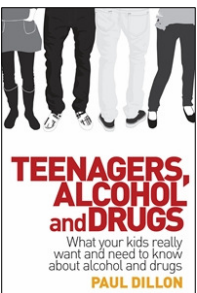
### **La diva nicotina: the story of how tobacco seduced the world**
